

Heinrich Schütz and George Frideric Handel will be in the spotlight when **Nota Bene Players & Singers (Howard Dyck, Artistic Director)** and **Theatre of Early Music (Daniel Taylor, Artistic Director)** perform at the SchützFest350 Festival.

2022 marks the 350th anniversary of the death of Heinrich Schütz, the undisputed giant of the early German baroque. *Musikalische Exequien*, his best-known work, was composed in 1635 or 1636 for the funeral of Count Heinrich II of Reuss-Gera.

The program also features *The Ways of Zion do Mourn*, composed in 1737 by Handel for the funeral of Queen Caroline.
